RE: Traffic Survey conducted on the 6400-blk SW 107<sup>th</sup> St

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The results of the traffic survey conducted on the 6400-blk SW 107<sup>th</sup> St were as follows:

July 7<sup>th</sup>-July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2014

- The Monday thru Friday average on a one-week period was 94 vehicles daily.
- The week average on a one-week period was 85 vehicles daily.
- The weekend average was 62 vehicles daily
- On average, 47.9% of the vehicles traveled westbound and 52.1% traveled eastbound on SW 107<sup>th</sup> St.
- The heaviest traffic (peak times) were 8:00am and 1:45pm.
- The average daily speed on this road was 20.8 mph, the minimum speed recorded was 1.3mph, and the maximum speed recorded was 42.6mph. The 85 percentile was 27.6mph.
- The speed limit at this location is 30mph.

This issue is near and dear to my heart. I have kids who bike on the street and around. These are residential areas. Not a day goes by when I find and often bring home dogs which have escaped from their homes, ( kids and other people not closing doors, etc) To have 30 plus miles an hour on streets in residential areas is outrageous.

We just returned from a trip up north and the speed limits in neighborhoods, of no matter what socioeconomic class are 10-15 mile an hour, max 25 miles an hour when

going through a town on a main highway. What is wrong with Dade County and Florida, in general?

I see some neighborhoods in Coral Gables have been successful with speed humps and traffic diversion circles.

This might be helpful.

Also, maybe asking the builders in the neighborhoods to advise their contractors and subs to drive more slowly on the way to their jobs. It may save a life.

I am copying the manager to ask that we get some traffic enforcement out to your street once you tell

her the address.

As for reducing the speed zone or other traffic calming, we have not had much success in getting approval from the county, but are looking into trying to get local control over local streets from the county. In addition I can tell you the one area we reduced a speed limit to 25, the lowest we have in Pinecrest ( other than school zones which are county wide). But even then residents tell us cars still speed. We have also not had success in advancing or getting approval for traffic calming on smaller streets , though I personally do want to see more of them, only SW 60 avenue has been approved for traffic circles so far.

You can also bring the concerns to our Transportation committee if you can get neighbors to agree with you.
