Pinecrest looking for burglar who was seen on social media bragging about stealing over \$500,000 in jewelry

Pinecrest, Fla. – Pinecrest Police have arrested two men who reportedly broke into two homes within two weeks and stole more than \$500,000 in jewelry. Police are looking for a third suspect who was seen on Facebook with the two men who were arrested with a bag full of \$100 bills bragging about their illegal earnings, and saying “We got a safe”.

A house in the 13200 block of Southwest 63rd Court was burglarized between 4:10 and 5:45 p.m. Friday, May 27th. The burglars stole a safe from the home with jewelry valued at more than \$500,000. Another home in the 6300 block of 107th Street was burglarized between 5:45 and 10:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 9th. The burglars stole jewelry valued at more than \$10,000, and a screwdriver that would later tie one of the arrested men to the burglary.

Raderius Glenn Collins, 18, who lives in the 22600 block of Southwest 114th Street (DOB 11/06/1997) was arrested May 27, 2016, and Marcus Terrell Parker, 27, who



lives in the 600 block of Northwest Seventh Street (DOB 03/06/1989) was arrested June 11, 2016.

Police found much of the stolen jewelry at Xodium Jewelry and Watch located in Southland Mall, 20505 South Dixie Highway via a search warrant. One of the arrested subjects told police that he and the other two subjects sold the stolen jewelry to the shop and received \$1300 each in return. He also told police he saw many of stolen gold pieces being melted in his presence at Xodium.

Jewelry was also found in the homes and vehicles of the arrested subjects and in a safe taken from one of the burglarized houses that was abandoned alongside an open field at SW 224th Street and 115th Avenue.
